This year we were able to emerge from the lingering pandemic and once again gather inperson to honor 766 of the region's African American high school male seniors at the 200+ Scholars Breakfast. The 1,300 attendees at the Virginia Beach Convention Center were treated to a powerful keynote address by former State Supreme Court Justice John Charles Thomas. His message to the students was so impactful that it was talked about for weeks after the event.

The Foundation was also pleased to award eleven scholarships to this year's honorees

thanks to the support of our financial supporters, including our presenting sponsor, **Towne Bank**.

The 200+ Men Scholars Academy continues to attract attention throughout southeastern Virginia as a much sought-after mentoring program for African American boys. The 2021-22 program year concluded with 45 young men enrolled in the program from Hampton Roads cities. Eleven of this past academic year's participants were seniors whose grade point averages met the criteria to be honored at the 200+ Scholars Breakfast. This year, we have students who have asked to join our program from as far away as Richmond.

I am pleased to present the 2022 Annual Report for The 200+ Men Foundation which highlights a few of our accomplishments from an extraordinary year. THE of Graduating Participants Are College Bound SCHOLARS ACADEMY

The 200+ Scholars Academy continues to attract widespread interest from parents, community leaders and organizations because of its intense focus on achieving positive outcomes from young African American males. More than 50 African American young men from cities throughout Hampton Roads are enrolled in the program. The Scholars Academy uses a combination of interactive classroom presentations and discussions, mentorship, and attendance at civic events to provide a holistic experience designed to instruct and inspire young men to achieve personal and academic success. The students participate in monthly developmental sessions on topics that include goal setting, mental



health, conflict resolution, and college preparation. In addition, through field trips and other enrichment activities, the students were afforded the opportunity to experience some of the amenities of the Hampton Roads area while interacting with successful role models in business, politics, public service, and other walks of life. Eighty-eight percent of the seniors who graduated from the program have gone on to college.

The Scholars Academy was fortunate to receive financial support from the Lewis Family Fund, Ethel T. Jones Fund, Jack and Jill of America and the Million Dollar Roundtable Foundation.
